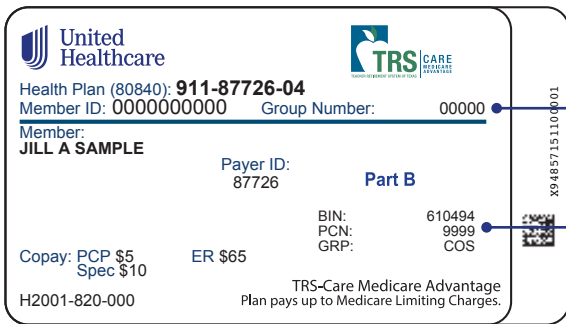




Get to know your TRS-Care Medicare Advantage member ID card

Your TRS-Care Medicare Advantage member ID card includes information about you and your coverage. Carry it with you wherever you go and show it when you visit your provider so they know how to bill for their services. This is the only ID card that you will need to utilize your TRS-Care Medicare Advantage benefits.

Front of the card (sample)



Member ID and Group Number
Use these when registering on www.UHCRetiree.com/TRS-CareMA or calling with questions. Also, **your providers (e.g., doctor, pharmacy)** will need this new information to verify your benefits and file claims.

Your Part B drug coverage
Your pharmacist will use this to file claims for Part B covered drugs. These Part B drugs are drugs you wouldn't usually give to yourself, like those you get at a doctor's office or hospital outpatient setting.

You will be asked to provide your member ID when you call the toll-free member phone number.

If your provider has any questions about the plan, they can visit the website or call the number listed here.

Pharmacist phone number
If your pharmacist has any questions about your Part B drug coverage, they can call the number listed here.
